# **Commentary**

This habilitation thesis explores the interplay between everyday routines and the spatial and temporal organization of urban life. Divided into two main parts, it first establishes the theoretical and methodological basis for analyzing urban timespaces, focusing on how habitual activities shape both the material and symbolic structures of cities. This section examines the rhythms of daily life through mobility patterns, institutional schedules, and broader urban policies, while also discussing the methodological strategies used to operationalize these concepts and potential directions for future research.

The second part provides an overview of eleven research papers, grouped into three thematic categories. The first examines commuting patterns to understand urban structures and relationships between places. The second focuses on the role of time, highlighting the repetitive nature of everyday actions and their contribution to urban rhythms. The final group of studies explores how individuals experience and represent their lived timespaces, considering personal and collective perceptions as well as institutional frameworks.

By adopting a relational perspective, the thesis aims to uncover how recurring activities contribute to the spatial and temporal ordering of urban environments. It seeks to explain how everyday mobility and timing produce stable yet dynamic structures and how these insights can inform urban planning and policy. The findings contribute to a deeper understanding of how urban life is patterned and how planning approaches might better reflect the lived realities of different social groups.
